Central Agreement Provides Additional PA Day - April 8th

In a letter to Directors of Education dated December 18^{th,} the Ministry has stipulated that the day must be devoted to provincial education priorities identified by the Minister.

The Deputy Minister specifically mentions Mathematics and/or Enhancing Equity, but other ministry initiatives include Achieving Excellence, Promoting Well-Being and Enhancing Public Confidence.

Boards are encouraged by the Ministry to consider designing professional learning opportunities in which teachers with shared subject areas/groups of students would be learning together.

Tell Them From Me Survey Advisory **Staff Should Use Caution!**

HDSB uses the **Tell Them From Me** survey to review its ongoing efforts to improve school effectiveness and to meet the data gathering and reporting requirements of Bill 13: The Accepting Schools Act.

HDSB invites teaching staff to complete the online and "completely anonymous" TTFM Focus on Learning Teacher Survey in the spring of each school year to provide feedback on school improvement initiatives.

In response to member concerns, we have ascertained the following:

- 1. The survey is completely voluntary. There is not to be tracking of which teachers have completed the survey.
- 2. The logins are scrambled by the program so HDSB cannot connect the dots to the hard data.
- 3. A third party, The Learning Bar, compiles the data and reports.

Comment Boxes Open to Viewing

However, the comment boxes are:

- 1. Visible to your school administration.
- 2. Used for school purposes only and are not a part of the board's research.

Staff should exercise caution entering comments. Depending on the comment, it may be traceable back to the source.

Critical Path for Secondary Staffing for the 2016-17 School Year: Key Dates

<u>February 29</u>: Deadline for teachers to request a voluntary transfer or exchange, a leave of absence, a leave extension, a reduced assignment, extension of a reduced assignment, or to confirm return from a leave or return to full assignment, all for September 2016.

March 9: Preliminary Staff Allocation meeting. Schools receive their initial allocation of sections for staffing, as well as letters for those teachers who are being declared potentially redundant.

<u>March 30</u>: Principal notifies teachers who are potentially surplus to school.

<u>April 5</u>: Internal Ad #1 (Open to all permanent/probationary teachers, including teachers surplus to school, but not teachers declared potentially redundant. No top up)

Mental Health First Aid Basic Training Oakville and District Labour Council

Mental health first aid (MHFA) is the help provided to a person developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis. The first aid is given until appropriate professional treatment is received or until the crisis is resolved.

Mental Health First Aid Basic is a 12-hour course focused on adults interacting with adults in all environments. The course discusses the following mental disorders: substance related disorders, mood related disorders, anxiety and trauma related disorders, and psychotic disorders

Crisis first aid skills for the following situations are learned: substance overdose, suicidal behaviour, panic attack, acute stress reaction, and psychotic episode.
